From Alsop Corner (corner of Rt. 44 and Rt. 10): South on Waterville Road (Rt. 10) for 350 feet. Turn right on Nassau Drive. Continue straight on main driveway to parking area.

The Alsop Meadows Conservation Area contains a mix of several forest types and open field areas that are used for haying, recreational, and community gardening purposes. The most distinctive elements of this property include a long frontage along the Farmington River, and a mix of rolling woods and fields that create several local vistas, including one looking south from Route 44. Alsop Meadows was acquired from the Woodford Farm Corporation in the late 1970s. The property is named for Stewart Johonnot Oliver Alsop (1914-1974), an Avon native who was a prominent newspaper columnist and political analyst. Many native American spear and arrow points have been found in the vicinity of Alsop Meadows.
