

Hazen Park



Where:

Located in the northeast corner of Avon, north of Alsop Corner, along Nod Road and Hazen Drive.

How to get there:

From Alsop Corner (corner of Rt. 44 and Rt. 10): North on Nod Road for 0.9 miles. Parking area 0.3 mi past Woodford Hills on right.

- OR -

Right on Woodford Hills Drive, left on Hazen Drive. Trailheads are on both sides of road.

GPS directions:

Search for 244 Nod Road, Avon, CT
- OR - 75 Hazen Drive, Avon, CT

Size: 54 acres

Features:

Mix of forest types
700 foot climb up Avon Mountain
Views of Farmington valley
Easy and moderately steep hiking
Connection to land trust trails

The original portion of Hazen Park was donated to the Town of Avon in 1963 by Mrs. Maynard Hazen in memory of her late husband. Mrs. Hazen stipulated that the land be used as open space and for recreation purposes.

A yellow-blazed hiking trail runs through much of the property, largely on an old farm/wood road. The trail offers easy walking between Nod Road and Hazen Drive, and both easy and moderately steep hiking from Hazen Drive towards the top of Avon Mountain. This portion of the trail features a small boardwalk. Hikers who make the trek from the Farmington Valley floor to the top of the yellow trail can continue onto Avon Land Trust Trails. These trails provide seasonal views of the valley.

Hazen Park contains no public facilities.
