




Connecticut's SNAP Employment and Training Program



Your Path To Employment

Participation in Employment and Training is voluntary in Connecticut. We run a 100% program and a 50% reimbursement program. Eligible SNAP recipients may self-initiate with any of our contractors and partners.

100% Contractors

With a FY15 budget of \$747,668, we have contracted with five organizations to provide E&T services within our 100% program; Career Resources, Community Renewal Team, Eastern CT Workforce Investment Board, The Kennedy Center and Workforce Alliance. Contracts are performance based and job focused. Services include; assessment, case management, job search, work experience and a remedial educational component.

50% Reimbursement Partnerships

Our FY15 budget of \$1,760,152 has allowed us to partner with five colleges and one nonprofit to provide short-term vocational training programs. Programs are employment focused based on information provided from the State Department of Labor and five Workforce Investment Boards. Programs include; Certified Nursing Assistant, Emergency Medical Technician, Certified Pharmacy Technician, Medical Billing and Coding, Massage Therapy, Culinary Arts, Safe Food Handling, Water and Waste Management, Precision Manufacturing and other growing occupations.
