#### Scam Alert! Residential Solar Contracts

Attorney General William Tong and Department of Consumer Protection Commissioner Michelle Seagull advised homeowners interested in residential solar panels to do careful research and be wary of misleading marketing and high-pressure sales tactics by solar companies.

The Office of the Attorney General has received complaints and has active investigations into multiple solar companies regarding sales and marketing practices. Solar companies often claim that solar panels increase the value of your home. There is currently no good data to support this claim. Many home buyers do not see solar panels as a benefit. Also, homeowners with leased panels or PPAs may have difficulty selling their homes since the new buyer and the company need to agree to transfer the lease or PPA.

# Town Partners with Webster Bank to Process July 2022 Tax Payments

Town of Avon has partnered with WEBSTER BANK and their lock-box payment services. Tax payments can be mailed to Webster Bank – who will process the payment - and each evening send to the Tax Collector an electronic payment file which will post the next morning. The advantage is the Town's tax revenue processed during the day is deposited the same evening into the Town's account.

You will find with the tax bill a "return payment envelope" addressed to Town of Avon, P.O. Box 847500, Boston, MA 02284-7500. Simply write your check (payable to the Town of Avon), include the payment stub, or stubs for bills being paid, apply postage and mail your payment. Please **DO NOT** drop tax payments off at Webster Bank's local branch.

The new lock box service is the Town's preferred method of accepting payments via U.S. Mail as it will expedite the processing of payments. Town will continue to accept payments by mail to Town Offices (60 West Main Street), in-person, or via the drop box located outside of the Collector of Revenue's Office (Building #2). We encourage taxpayers to pay online via credit card, e-check or by phone (888-332-0286). We thank you for your attention to this new proce-

Transfer Station Permits (Senior [\$60], Recycling Only [\$40]) for FY 2022/2023 (begins 7/1/22). Permits online via OpenGov Citizen Services.

#### **HOW DO I APPLY FOR A PERMIT?**

https://avonct.viewpointcloud.com/. Create a user account with OpenGov Citizen Services or sign into existing OpenGov account. Application completed, visit Transfer Station office to pick up permit tags. Payment: credit card, e-check, cash or check. Credit card & e-check payments online. Cash or check, bring payment when you pick up tag. Recommend paying by credit card or e-check. Paying with cash, exact change preferable. Purchasing Senior Permit, bring proof of age when you pick up your tag.
