Changes to Budget Process due to COVID-19

This issue of the Town newsletter is devoted to the proposed budget. In a typical year, this article would provide readers with an explanation of the budget approval process that is described in the Town's Charter. But, as you know, this is not a typical year. The COVID-19 pandemic has required all of us to change the way we do business, including the approval of our annual budget. For more information on Town operations that have been impacted by COVID-19, and other resources related to the local, state and federal response to the pandemic, please visit the Town's website.

On March 21st, the Governor issued Executive Order 7I (EO 7I) to protect public health and safety during the COVID-19 pandemic and response. EO 7I suspended in-person budget adoption requirements for municipalities, including Avon's Board of Finance Public Hearing, Annual Town Meeting and Referendum. In accordance with EO 7I, the Town Council authorized the Board of Finance, as the Town's budget-making authority, to adopt a budget for the fiscal year 2020/2021 and to set a mill rate. The Council also adopted a new budget calendar to facilitate this process, as follows:

- The Board of Finance will hold a **Special Meeting** with the Town Council and the Board of Education on **Monday**, **May 4**th **at 7:00 p.m.** Details of the proposed budget will be presented to the Board at this time.
- The Board of Finance will hold a <u>Budget Workshop</u> with the Town Council and the Board of Education on <u>Monday</u>, <u>May 11th at 7:00 p.m.</u> The Board of Finance will consider the adoption of a budget and the setting of a mill rate.

In order to practice appropriate social distancing measures, these meetings will not be open to the public to attend inperson. However, on each agenda, the Town will provide instructions for the public to access the meetings virtually. All meeting materials will be posted on the Town's website prior to the meeting.

In order to help us to facilitate virtual meetings, we ask that the public submit their commentary on the budget to the Town in writing on or before May 11th at 12 noon. Commentary can be emailed to budgetcomments@avonct.gov, or mailed to the Town Manager's Office at 60 West Main Street, and will be provided to the Board of Finance for review and included in the official meeting records. The following pages include an overview of the Town Council's proposed budget that will be considered by the Board of Finance. The Town Council proposes an overall fiscal year 2020/2021 budget of \$99,855,760. This represents a budget increase of \$4,461,615 or 4.68%, and an increase in the levy of 4.02%. The associated mill rate would increase from 32.90 to 34.04 or 3.47%.

Dog Registration

On May 18th, the Town Clerk's Office will begin issuing July 2020 dog licenses. Renewal notices will be mailed to all registered dog owners. To purchase a license, simply bring or send a copy of the dog's valid rabies certificate and spayed/neutered certificate along with \$8.00 or \$19.00 if unaltered dogs to: Avon Town Clerk, 60 West Main St., Avon, CT 06001-3719. Please make check payable to the Town of Avon. There is a \$1.00 penalty fee per dog per month if you fail to register your dog on or before June 30th. Remember that Connecticut law requires that all dogs be licensed.

Sewer Use Charges

The first installment on the sewer use charges for calendar year 2020 was due April 1, 2020. Payments are due by May 1, 2020. Please mail checks to: Collector of Revenue 60 West Main Street, Avon, CT 06001. There is also a secure box located outside Building #2. Payments can also be made online thru the Town's website.

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Reminders from the Avon Police Department

Slow Down, Keep our Community Safe! You may have noticed that the Avon Police Department recently increased traffic enforcement efforts on a number of local roads. Drivers have been stopped for speeding, failing to obey stop signs, passing in a no passing zone, and more. Motorists who violate traffic laws can expect to receive anything from a payable infraction of \$150 or more (passing a school bus displaying flashing red lights can cost you \$470!), to a summons for court. Please respect your neighbors by obeying the traffic laws and driving through town as if your own children are playing on every street.

Shape Your Future with the 2020 Census!

The 2020 Census has been underway since mid-March. The Census is mandated by the Constitution and the results are used to reapportion the House of Representatives and to distribute more than \$675 billion in federal funds annually. If you haven't done so already, please make an effort to respond to the Census online, via phone, or via U.S. Mail by the end of April. Unresponsive households will be visited by Census employees in May to collect responses in person. If you are visited at home, you can verify that your visitor is a Census employee by confirming that they have a valid ID badge with their photograph, a U.S. Department of Commerce watermark, and an expiration date. If you still have questions about their identity you can call 800-923-8282 to speak with a local Census Bureau representative. If you determine that the person who came to your door is not from the Census Bureau, please contact the Avon Police Department immediately. Remember, the Census Bureau will never ask for your social security number, your bank account or credit card numbers, or money or donations. For more information visit www.2020census.gov.
